The mission of the Brown County MRC is to help build and enhance the emergency preparedness and public health infrastructure including response capabilities in the event of an emergency or disaster in our Community by providing a coordinated response of locally recruited health and health support volunteers

WHY VOLUNTEER?

Emergencies can happen with little or no warning, often overwhelming local emergency systems. The results can leave Brown, and surrounding, County residents cut off from critical resources for days. The MRC provides volunteers with the skills needed to strengthen their communities for emergencies and disasters.

WHO CAN VOLUNTEER?

The Medical Reserve Corps responds to public health issues that may arise during an emergency, so while a medical or health background is helpful, it is not necessary. Anyone who is interested is encouraged to join.

BENEFITS OF BEING PART OF THE MRC:

Being registered as an emergency worker means you work within the established system for emergency response. You will obtain the most current preparedness training at no cost to you.

WHAT MAKES THE MRC SO UNIQUE?

Members work within the Emergency management System and are pre-trained, pre-registered, and pre-credentialed allowing them to respond to emergencies quickly and efficiently.
